

ROAD RULES FOR PARKING AND STOPPING

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. These rules are communicated to the public on parking signs.

Parking control signs are regulatory signs. Drivers must obey the direction on them and it is an offence to disobey them. Fines apply for parking illegally and in some situations, demerit points also apply.

NO STOPPING AND NO PARKING SIGNS



NO STOPPING SIGN: This sign means that you must not park or stop your vehicle in the direction of the arrow, unless there is a medical or other emergency.

Sometimes a No Stopping area is indicated by a solid yellow edge line. Hours of operation may apply to some signs. This means restrictions apply for those times only.

The fine for parking illegally in a No Stopping area is **\$257**. The fine for parking illegally in a **School Zone** will incur a fine of **\$330** and **2 demerit points**.



NO PARKING SIGN: You must not stop for more than two minutes in a No Parking area. You must remain in or within 3 metres of the vehicle.

Hours of operations may apply to some signs. This means restrictions apply for those times only. Mobility Parking Permit holders are allowed to park for up to 5 minutes in a No Parking area.

The fine for illegally parking in a No Parking zone is **\$110**. The fine for illegally parking in No Parking area within a **School Zone** is **\$183** and **2 demerit points**.

Note:

If a parking control sign indicates that it applies on a particular day(s) of the week, the sign does not apply on a public holiday unless information on the sign indicates that it does.
